

Department 107: Miniature Dairy Goat Show

Combined Junior/Senior Doe Show

Start time follows conclusion of the Open Dairy Goat Show

Animals on grounds by 12:00pm

Rules and Regulations:

1. This show is sanctioned by the Miniature Dairy Goat Association and their rules shall govern. The Combined Sr. & Jr. doe shows are sanctioned for the following breeds to be shown in this order: Mini Nubians, AOM (Mini Alpine, Mini Guernsey, Mini LaMancha, Mini Oberhasli, Mini Saanen, Mini Toggenburg) No horned animals allowed. The combined Sr & Jr. doe shows are not separately sanctioned.
2. Entry fees are \$10.00 per animal and must accompany the entry form. There will be no refund of entry fees for any reasons. No faxed entry forms allowed. Substitutions will be allowed within the same breed and show. There is no limit to the number of animals which can be shown by an exhibitor, but only 2 premiums will be paid per exhibitor per class. All animals must be tattooed with assigned tattoo numbers or microchipped before arrival at the show. No tattoos or EIDs (microchips) should be applied at the show. Owners of animals with EID (microchips) must have a microchip reader available at the show. Champion and Reserve Champion animals will not receive official awards if the tattoo or microchip cannot be read. *Tattoo(s) and/or EIDs are allowed as primary identification and must match the recorded information exactly on the registration certificate to receive credit for an official "leg". If the tattoo is correct but in the wrong location, MDGA will award the Championship but without the "official leg". If the identification is incorrect for that animal, said animal will be disqualified.
3. No tie stalling will be allowed, exhibitors are responsible for providing enough help to hold animals not in pens or trailers, ringside. There are no pens for open exhibitors. Be prepared to work from your trailer and there will be holding pens ringside while each breed is showing. Some power hookups available. Bring your own power cords and shade.
4. Eligibility to participate in an MDGA-sanctioned Live Show requires that you be a current MDGA member in good standing.
5. Queen Anne's County 4-H members are not required to pay pen fees but must pay the entry fees. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed, water, hay and bedding.
6. The base date is August 16, 2024 which is the date the animal is to be judged.
7. For all entries in a sanctioned show, either a registration certificate or an email from the registrar showing that an application for registration has been submitted to the registry must be presented to the show secretary or appointed trustee at the time of check-in.
8. All animals must be provided with a collar
9. The show committee, QA County Fair Board, Queen Anne's County 4-H park, and the MDGA will not be responsible for loss, damage, or accident to any person, animal or property.
10. The show order is subject to change at the discretion of the show chairman, if needed to facilitate the progress of the show. However, in no event will the show start before 12:00pm.
11. Exhibitor shall be defined as the name as it appears on the official MDGA registration certificate. No entries will be allowed under various individual names that do not appear on the MDGA certificate at check in. Maximum entry of 2 animals per exhibitor per class will be paid premiums.
